

Board of Directors Report Minutes of Thursday, October 6, 2022



The NEPA Alliance held a Board of Directors Meeting on Thursday, October 6, 2022, at Radisson Station Hotel, Scranton, PA. Board Chairperson Mary Beth Wood called the meeting to order at 4:00pm.

Board Chairperson Mary Beth Wood asked the Board of Directors to join her in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

ACTION ITEMS

<u>Minutes</u> - A motion was made by Chris Barrett and seconded by Vince Galko to accept the minutes from the Board of Directors Meeting of June 15, 2022, as presented. **Motion carried**

<u>Financial Report</u> – Wendi reported that on the Statement of Activities as of August 31, 2022, NEPA has total revenues and total expenses of approximately \$827,000. She further reported that there is a small increase in net assets of \$616. Wendi noted that NEPA is two months into the new fiscal year. She reported that staff is still finalizing the year end numbers and the auditors are expected to be at NEPA at the end of October.

President & CEO Report

Jeff reported that the Networking Reception is coming together very nicely. He reported that the attendance numbers have been fluctuating with approximately 300 plus attendees. Jeff also reported that the sponsorship is approximately \$42,000. He thanked the Board for their sponsorship and attendance. Jeff stated tonight's program is very brief and we will be replaying NEPA's video from last year because the quality was so good and it tells the NEPA story very well. He noted that the staff is meeting all their metrics and the funding partners are pleased.

Jeff stated that NEPA partnered with Congressman Matt Cartwright and NASA to connect local businesses with the NASA supply chain. He also stated that the Bring the World to Pennsylvania was held (in person) at the Radisson on September 23rd with great attendance. Jeff reported that NEPA will be starting a new revolving loan fund program for small businesses after being awarded \$5 million from DCED. Jeff noted that ARC will be carrying over \$8 million dollars this year because of additional money. Jeff further noted that if anyone knows of any projects to reach out to Kurt.

Mary Beth thanked the Board for their sponsorship and for their attendance today.

There being no further business Board Chairman Mary Beth Wood adjourned the meeting at 4:20pm. She noted that the next meeting will be November 2, 2022.

NEPA Annual Networking Reception

The Business Finance Center has been able to close 9 loans totaling \$1,278,000.00. Through these loan closings, the small businesses are expected to create 19 jobs and retain 39 jobs in the next 3 years within the 7-county region that NEPA Alliance serves. International Business Development Program

- The International Business Development staff recorded thirty-eight (38) Export Actions and generated six (6) International Projects to Pennsylvania's Authorized Trade Representatives from September 15, 2022, through October 21, 2022. Staff processed six (6) Global Access Program (GAP) application during this timeframe. GAP is an export promotion grant administered by the Pennsylvania Office of International Business Development (OIBD) under a State Trade Expansion Program (STEP) award from the U.S. Small Business Administration.
- In partnership with the Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development Office of International Business Development (OIBD), staff hosted *Bringing the World to Northeastern Pennsylvania* on Friday, September 23, 2022, at the Radisson Lackawanna Station Hotel in Scranton, PA. This is the International Business Program's premier event, when NEPA, as the Regional Export Network partner for OIBD hosts Pennsylvania's Authorized Trade Representatives (ATRs) for one-on-one meetings with businesses interested in or currently exporting. Usually held annually, this was the first in-person event in three (3) years. Twenty-one (21) companies participated generating approximately one hundred (100) meetings.
- This year, NEPA also worked with OIBD, the Governor's Action Team and Wilke University to host a pre-event networking reception on Thursday, September 22, 2022, at Wilkes University. The goal of this event was to bring together international business students, local companies, and

ENGAGE!

On behalf of the Northeast Pennsylvania Partnerships for Regional Economic Performance (PREP) partners, NEPA annually applies for the *Engage!* initiative. *Engage!* is a Pennsylvania statewide business retention and expansion (BRE) program designed to interact with targeted companies regularly and proactively. The overall goal of *Engage!* is to retain existing businesses and to help them grow and expand by building solid relationships with business owners or key decision makers and economic development partners. NEPA received \$195,000 for *Engage!* for FY 22-23 and has subcontracted with 13 partners to complete the project deliverables.

In response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, NEPA is offering, through the "Get Connected" initiative, ecommerce technical assistance to businesses. NEPA has contracted with three web development/tech firms to assist the launch of this initiative, which offers a free suite of services to develop an online sales platform that will assist in stabilizing the business and generate sales and clients during the pandemic. Thus far, NEPA has assisted over 70 businesses. Phase 4 business recipients are listed below. Clients in Phase 4 received \$3,500 in consulting support and training services from the University of Scranton SBDC and the Wilkes University SBDC for their business and e-commerce platform. Funding in the amount of \$141,500 was received from the Lackawanna County Department of Planning and Economic Development for Phase 4. This funding will allow us to assist 32 firms in Lackawanna County through the Get Connected program. NEPA received an Impact Award from the National Association of Development Organizations (NADO) for its Get Connected program. This award was under its

StartUp NEPA

NEPA has raised \$700,000 in support of our Angel Fund initiative. Official launch meeting was held in January 2022, and member meetings have been held monthly since April. To date, several businesses have pitched and one investment commitment has been made. Discover NEPA will be featuring this initiative on its website sometime before the end of the year.

NEPA Community Impact Fund

NEPA's new affiliate organization, the NEPA Community Impact Fund, was formally certified a Community Development Entity (CDE) and is actively seeking an allocation of New Markets Tax Credits (NMTC) from the U.S. Department of the Treasury. NEPA is actively seeking tax credits on behalf of three clients. We were unsuccessful in securing a NMTC allocation from the 2020 and 2021 rounds. NEPA is soliciting projects from the Commonwealth of PA with capital costs ranging from \$5M-\$60M that need NTMC subsidies to make the project viable. We will submit our next application for the 2023 round in January of 2023.

NORTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA NONPROFIT & COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE CENTER

NCAC Membership: NCAC currently has 125 active members. Membership renewal notices were sent out in early October, and the membership fee increase went into effect on 10/1/22. With the expansion of the Economic Services team, NCAC is now offers more services to members including, access to Candid's Compensation Report, a list of local nonprofit consultants, our 25 page list of local funders, RFQ templates, and discounts to nonprofit conferences.

NCAC will be offering a grant writing working in Monroe County in November.

NEPA Grantmakers Forum: In collaboration with the Harry & Jeannette Weinberg Foundation, the McGowan Charitable Trust, The Luzerne Foundation, the Scranton Area Community Foundation, and the Margaret Briggs Foundation, NCAC launched the NEPA Grantmakers initiative. NCAC will hold a Grantmakers leadership meeting in January 2023.

Monroe County Community Foundation: Community Foundation board meetings have been held monthly since May. After completing a search for a marketing firm, a contract was signed with Condron Media in September to assist the Foundation in developing its logo, mission, vision, and values. The Foundation has also chosen a part-time Executive Director whose contract is being prepared for signing.

BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE (BRTF) / TOBYHANNA ARMY DEPOT

NEPA manages the Blue Ribbon Task Force (BRTF), which was organized in 1992 to provide regional community support for the preservation and protection of Tobyhanna Army Depot from the base closure process known as Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC).

NEPA received several grants from the Pennsylvania Military Community Enhancement Commission to support the Depot. The funding was used to develop a SWOT Analysis of TYAD as compared to other installations. NEPA is currently collaborating with a consultant, Edwards+Strunk, Inc., a consulting firm based in Madison Township, Lackawanna County, to develop and implement a fundraising plan. The



newest grant received was for \$49,750 and announced in January 2022.

NEPA annually prepares an Economic Impact Analysis of the Depot. In the last update, which is for FY 2021, it was established that the total impact of the Depot is an estimated \$3.3 billion in economic activity, an estimated 8,744 jobs, and an estimated \$715.5 million in labor income within an eleven (11) county region in Northeast Pennsylvania.

NEPA team members, along with the BRTF consulting team Edwards and Strunk, toured TYAD in April. Biweekly touchpoints are taking place to continue the establishment of a fundraising plan, and the next BRTF meeting will be held on December 20, 2022.

Featured Article: This month's article presents the not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates for the nation, state, region, and each of the seven counties within the NEPA service area.

Not Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates

According to the first chart, the not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates, as provided by the PA




WorkStats Program of the Center for Workforce Information & Analysis at the PA Department of Labor & Industry, indicate that the average regional unemployment rate was 8.4 percent from September 2020 to August 2021 and 5.8 percent from September 2021 to August 2022. The average national unemployment rate from September 2020 to August 2021 was 6.2 percent and it was 3.9 percent from September 2021 to August 2022. The average state unemployment rate from September 2020 to August 2021 was 7.3 percent and it was 4.8 percent from September 2021 to August 2022.


According to the second chart, the difference in the monthly not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates between the region and nation was 1.9 percentage points in September 2020 before fluctuating to its maximum of 2.5 percentage points in December 2020. It then fluctuated to its minimum of 1.6 percentage points in December 2021 and May 2022 before increasing to 2.0 percentage points in August 2022. During the 24-month period, the average not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.1 percent in the nation and 7.1 percent in the region.

In September 2020, the difference in the monthly not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates between the region and state was 0.9 percentage points before decreasing to its minimum of 0.8 percentage points in October 2020. It then increased to its maximum of 1.3 percentage points in January and March 2021 before fluctuating to 1.0 percentage points in August 2022. During the 24-month period, the average not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Pennsylvania was 6.1 percent.

TRANSPORTATION PLANNING SERVICES DIVISION

2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Development

- The NEPA MPO 2023 Transportation Improvement Program development is complete. The NEPA MPO Committees approved the 2023 TIP and related documents in June. Staff sent the TIP package to PennDOT Central Office in July and it was approved by the State Transportation Commission in August. The Statewide Transportation Improvement Program was then submitted to the federal agencies for approval which was received from USDOT by letter dated 9/29/2022. The 2023 TIP went into effect on October 1, 2022.
- The NEPA 2023 TIP totals \$677.5 million and includes:
 - ❖ 96 Bridge and Highway projects, totaling \$250.7 million.
 - ❖ 22 Transit projects, totaling \$11.3 million.
 - ❖ 11 Interstate projects, totaling \$415.5 million.

Long Range Transportation Plan Update

- The NEPA MPO kicked off the update of the Long Range Transportation Plan in April. Due to our Air Quality Conformity status, our LRTP is required to be updated every four years. The LRTP consultant, Michael Baker International, has developed a Scope of Services for the plan. It was shared at the September 20th Technical Committee meeting. A work order has been executed with Michael Baker International and work on the LRTP began in October.
- In order to fund the LRTP development, the NEPA MPO applied for and received \$100,000 in Supplemental Planning funds from Central Office. This amount will be matched by \$25,000 in local funds. The Supplemental Planning Funds will also be used for updates to other NEPA MPO plans including the Public Involvement Plan, Title VI Plan, Limited English Proficiency Plan and Coordinated Transit Plan. We anticipate discussions about the update of those plans will occur during the 2nd year of our current work program.

Eastern PA Regional Freight Study

- The development of a regional freight study has been identified as a task in the current UPWP. Given the regional nature of freight movements, particularly due to the warehousing and distribution growth in the NEPA MPO and the adjoining Lehigh Valley and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre MPOs, staff has been in discussions with neighboring Planning Partners about developing a collaborative regional freight plan.
- Five MPOs have agreed to conduct a joint freight plan as the Eastern Pennsylvania Freight Alliance NEPA MPO, Lehigh Valley MPO, Lackawanna-Luzerne MPO, Reading MPO and Lebanon MPO. The group has developed a framework and submitted an application to Central Office for supplemental planning funds for the initiative and was awarded \$280,000 in supplemental planning funds to be leveraged by a \$70,000 match provided by the participating MPOs.
- WSP USA, Inc. was selected as the consultant for the plan. Contracting with WSP has been completed and a kickoff meeting was held on October 6th. Development of the plan is expected over the next year, with completion by September 2023.

Transportation Funding Opportunities

- The IIJA Bipartisan Infrastructure Legislation (BIL) created several new discretionary grant programs. Staff has regularly shared information about the grant opportunities with the NEPA MPO committee members and through NEPA's newsletters. The Department of Transportation (US DOT) has recently launched the DOT Navigator website as a resource for programs funded through the IIJA/BIL. In addition, US DOT has developed a Competitive Grant Funding Matrix which includes information about the funding programs including program descriptions, eligible applicants and notices of funding opportunities (NOFOs). Click here to learn more.
- PennDOT is currently accepting applications for funding through its <u>Multimodal Transportation Fund</u>. Applications are due by November 14, 2022. Funding can be used for projects related to streetscapes, lighting, sidewalk enhancement and pedestrian safety; for projects improving connectivity or utilization of existing transportation assets; and for projects related to transit-oriented development. Municipalities, counties, school districts, economic development organizations, public transportation agencies, ports, rail freight and passenger rail entities are eligible to apply. A local match of 30% is required. The NEPA MPO will have the opportunity to review and provide comments to PennDOT Central Office about project applications submitted in the region.

National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure State Plan

- The National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program was created by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. In order to receive funding through the NEVI program, each state must draft and submit a state plan for EV infrastructure. Pennsylvania's NEVI Plan has been approved and outlines Pennsylvania's approach to the strategic deployment of a convenient, reliable, affordable, and equitable EV charging network to support range confidence for Pennsylvanians and visitors over the course of the NEVI Formula Program.
- PennDOT will be rolling out information about engaging the public and businesses and how the discretionary funds will be allocated in the coming weeks. A stakeholder information session is scheduled for October 25th at the Lackawanna County Center for Public Safety. A PennDOT webinar on electric vehicle infrastructure is also scheduled for November 1st.

Geographic Information Systems (GIS)

- GIS staff is continuing to complete mapping activities for the transportation program. Staff

Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS)

- NEPA is responsible for the collection of data for the Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS). The HPMS is a national level highway information system that includes data on the extent, condition, performance, use and operating characteristics of the nation's highways. MPOs are required to update and confirm data included in the HPMS on an annual basis. The collection involves field work at over 90 locations within the NEPA MPO region identified by PennDOT Central Office.
- Staff attended an online HPMS workshop conducted by Central Office on July 26-27. Data
 collection efforts for this year are well underway and will be completed by the beginning of
 December.

Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP)

• NEPA has partnered with PennDOT to deliver the LTAP training series in the Lackawanna-Luzerne Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) region, the NEPA MPO region and Wayne County. In fiscal year 2021-2022, 15 LTAP classes were held, with 218 attendees. 
